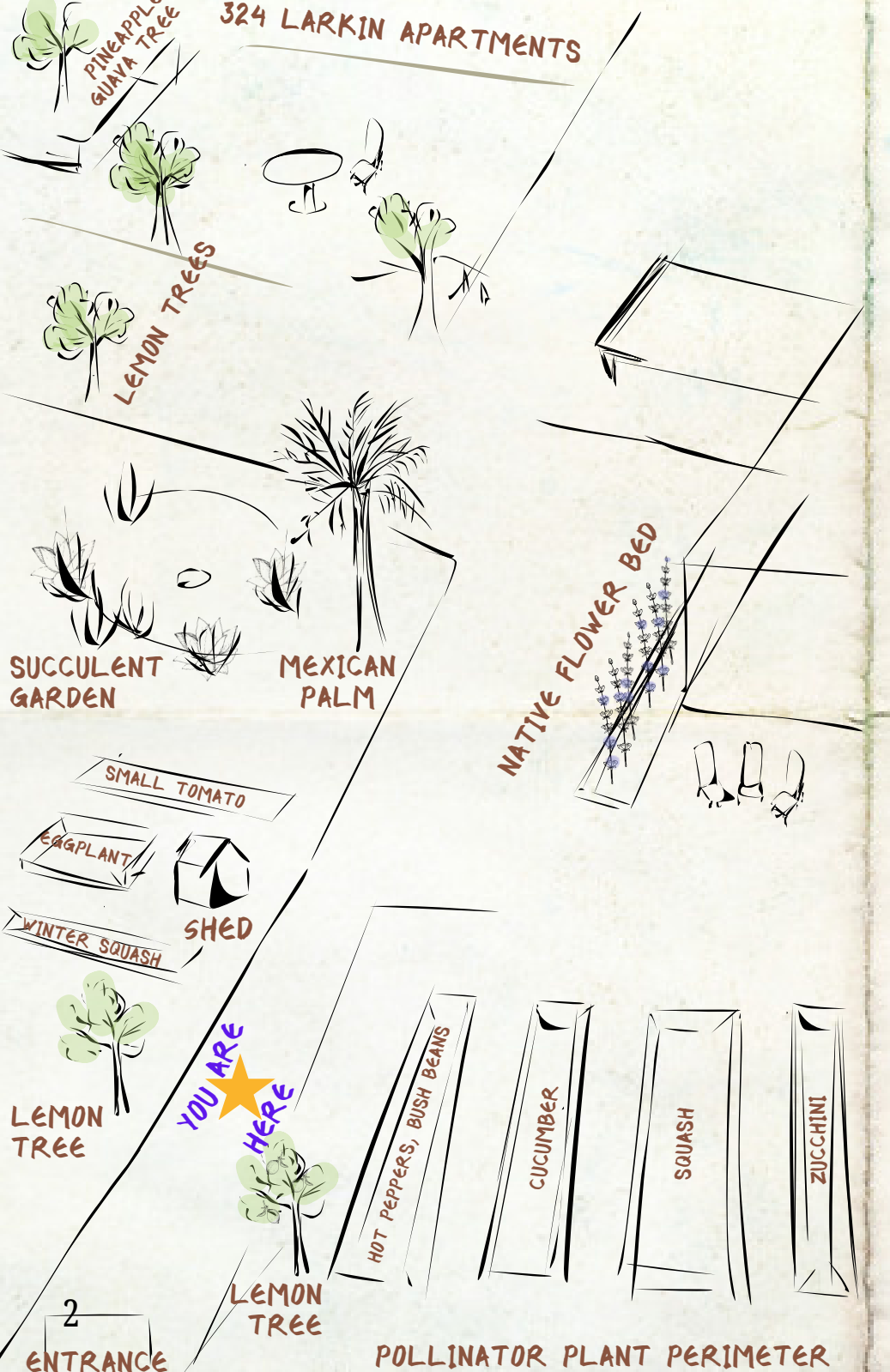

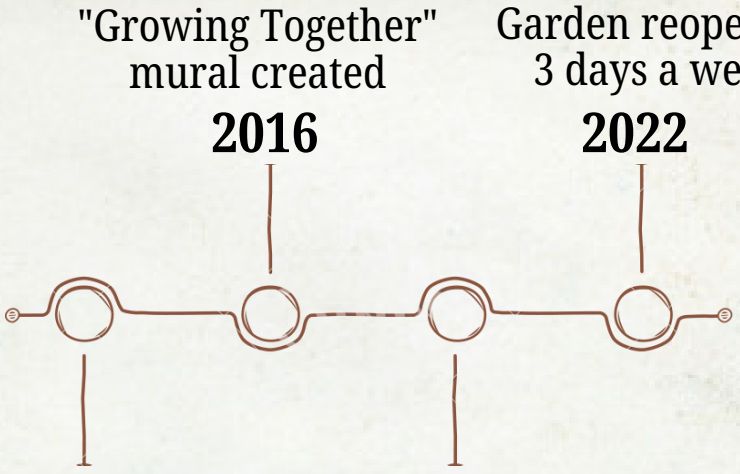

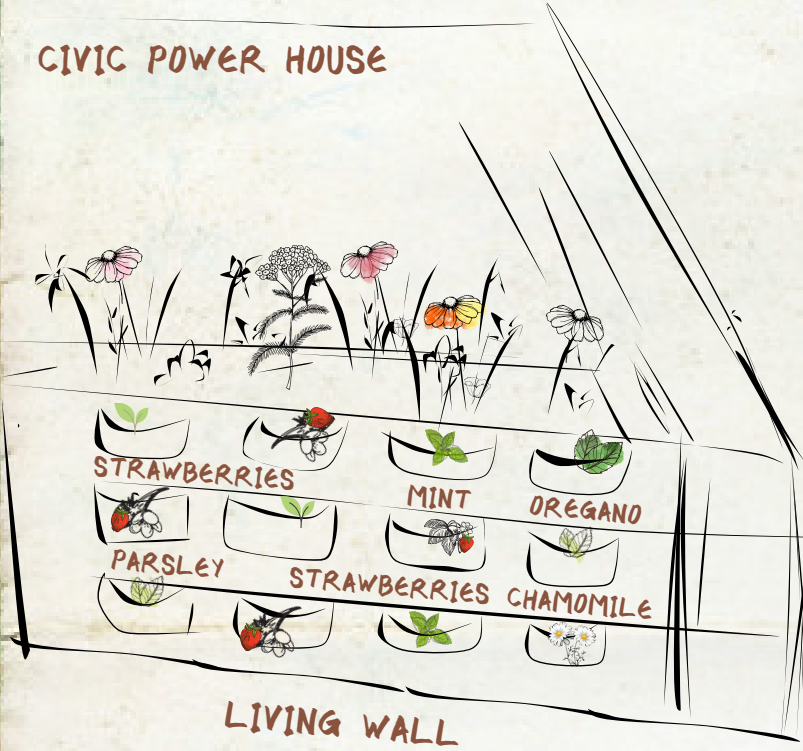

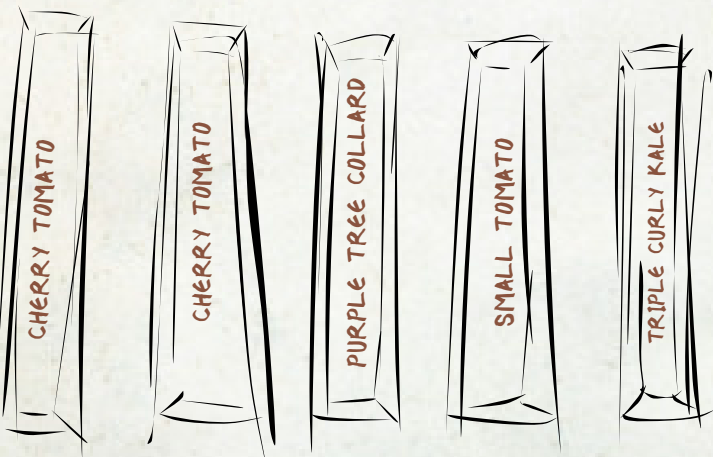

With open hands in the shape of a heart, the garden's abundance is shown with offerings of fresh carrots, tomatoes, kale, potatoes, and cabbage. As the sun rises along the San Francisco fog above the arch, the guitarist, Mr. Galicia, plays "Somewhere Over the Rainbow" to serenade the plants. Musical notes weave into a spiral of water that carries a boat with three passengers, to symbolize the many journeys that bring people to their home in the Tenderloin
